I am happy to write in support of the application from Arts & Cultural Exchange (ACE) to fund Community Arts and Cultural Development (CACD) professional training for emerging producers from Western Sydney. I share the urgency of ACE's rationale as it is vitally important to seek and identify next generation, ethical and critically aware CACD workers in our region.

I value ACE's layered program plan and partnerships and believe that investing in 16 emerging producers is an investment in whole sector professional development. With almost 45 years of my own work across sectors of community cultural engagement, I want to be part of this program that facilitates fresh participatory learning and collaborative networks for and with others in the future.

I live and work on Dharug Land (in Greater Western Sydney) where I have extensive experience in developing innovative CACD programs. I am a recipient of the Australia Council's Ros Bower Award (2010) and I received a Community Cultural Development Fellowship (2005). I have had an ongoing focus on Arab cultures since 1991, through contemporary production, cultural heritage and performance work. I initiated Arab Theatre Studio in 2014 and since 2016 I have been a joint Creative Producer.

I have a long term relationship with ACE spanning generations of its evolution, through collaborating in projects as well as attending their local events and programs. I look forward to participating as a CACD program trainer to share my experience of models of CACD work, as well as supporting ACE in any other capacity. I have a long term commitment to greater Western Sydney which has grown in demographic complexity and public infrastructure, although still not matched with an equitable share of public resources. Sectors of community and arts workers have also grown, and I have witnessed the shift to individualism that leans to so-called social engagement which is often extractive and product oriented.

I have remained connected to local community arts practice on a grass roots level. Since 2017 I have been contracted annually by Fairfield City Council to develop and facilitate grant writing workshops, and mentoring with community members, for Council's small grant with a specific focus on CACD. The relevance here to my support of ACE's program is that in every annual evaluation report I repeatedly recommend to Council - "Consider future programs where participants are mentored within real life CACD projects in Western Sydney". The proposed ACE program will bring to life this immersive learning experience with the paid internships.

I do look forward to a positive outcome of this application - it will support collective contribution to our living archive of practice and it will build intergenerational knowledge of working in collaboration with communities to make inclusive arts and culture, grounded in respect and self-determination.
